FSUSBC Annual Meeting & Tournaments

The Florida State USBC Annual Meeting was held in Fort Myers at the Crowne Plaza with 123 voting delegates and 23 alternates, hosted by the Southwest Florida local association and the Lee County Sports Commission. Thank you all for making the Annual meeting a huge success. The 2024 Annual will be held in St. Petersburg/Clearwater at the Marriott, October 11,12 and 13th. Gulf Coast USBC will host the meeting in 2024. Save the Date info update is already posted on the front page of our state website. One change for the Memorial Service for next year, we are sending out a form with the credentials form and asking each association to report their deceased members with a deadline, that way no one will be missed on winlabs. The biggest change in the coming year will be that the Annual Youth luncheon will NOT be held in October at the Annual meeting. The board approved moving the youth luncheon Awards and Hall of Fame Luncheon to July. The

luncheon will be held Saturday, July 27th at 11:30 in St. Petersburg at the St. Pete/Clearwater Marriott. This change will give the youth a better opportunity to attend since it is being held in the summer. The annual tournament awards and Hall of Fame event is always a great time and well attended and will continue to be held at the annual meeting. Flyers were handed out at the meeting for invitations to host the 2025 annual meeting, March 31st is the deadline for your association to submit applications. Check out the website for a form if you didn't pick one up.

The **2025** Tournament sites were awarded by a vote of the delegates at the recent annual meeting. The **OPEN** will be hosted by the Gulf Coast and Suncoast jointly, the **WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP** will be hosted by the Broward County USBC. The **YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP**, will be hosted by Lake County, in Tavares, **PEPSI** will be hosted by Tallahassee, the **MIXED MEMORIAL** will be hosted by Southwest Florida USBC, the **MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP** will be hosted by Broward County and the **Women's Senior** will be hosted by Lake County in Tavares.

Entries for the upcoming **2024 tournaments** are out, they were distributed at the annual meeting and are on our State website and should be at your local bowling centers. The **OPEN** will be in Polk County, the **PEPSI** will be in Lake County, the **Mixed** in Broward County, the **Youth** Championship will be be co-hosted by the Greater Tampa USBC and East Pasco, the **Women's** Championship will be hosted by the Gulf Coast Association all in one center at Seminole, the **Senior Women's** will be in Southwest Florida. and the **Men's Championship** will be in Southwest Florida.

As your tournament's chairperson, I want to thank everyone for entering our tournaments and hope you will continue to support them. Bowlers bringing entries are what makes our events successful and a larger prize list. \$5000 in donations from USBC Bowl TV has been added to the OPEN, \$3,000 to the Women's Championship and \$2000 to the Youth Championship.

The 2026 tournament bid information will be sent out to all Association Managers and Presidents in February. Now is the time to be thinking about bidding on any of our 7 tournaments. Local association will receive 75% of the profits on all of our adult tournaments and are required to do staffing for the tournament. Detailed information about each tournament will be sent with the deadline information.

In closing my report, I would like to say a BIG Thank you to all of our tournament directors that did an amazing job this past year, Dalia Keyes, Allen Solomon, Ashley Chisano, Debbie Whitten, and Bruce Combs. Tony Adkins, our new Association Manager will be the tournament director for the Open in 2024.

I want to take this time to say Happy Thanksgiving, Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, Happy Kwanzaa, Boxing Day, to all of our Florida members, bowling partners and Sponsors. I think I covered everyone. All of you make our association, The Florida State USBC the greatest in the country and I always say Florida bowlers are the best!

Hello fellow bowlers, my name is Michael Fleischacker, and I am the newly elected President of the Tallahassee USBC association. I am super excited not only being President but looking back at the past bowling season, I am proud of what we achieved.

This past season, Tallahassee hosted the 2023 Pepsi youth tournament over 5 weekends. This is the first time this community held any state tournament. The support for our community was amazing. I want to thank Leon County, Capital lanes and their employees, and all of the volunteers over the 5 weeks not only here from Tallahassee but also Allen Solomon and his team. To be able to award over \$105,000 in scholarships was amazing.

Besides the Pepsi tournament we had one of our youth bowlers compete in the state youth tournament and won all events. Another first for Tallahassee. We look forward to seeing Bradon Colaire receive his award at the state lunch banquet in October.

It does not stop there; Tallahassee now has high school bowling. With the assistance of Leon County school district, we now have 4 of our high schools holding matches and preparing to go to the district competition at the end of October.

I am excited for the upcoming season and what the future of bowling in Tallahassee.

The 2024 Pepsi Tournament will be held at Lakeside Lanes in Tavares for five weekends from March 16 through April 21. Over 2600 youth bowlers from every corner of Florida will participate in this year's event. Tavares is located in beautiful Lake County (www.visitlakefl.com), north of Orlando and south of Ocala.

Rules packets were emailed to centers and youth directors in late September. If you are, or have, a new youth director in your center please send your email address to Allen at beachbowlyouth@aol.com In-center house qualifying will take place during November and January. We would hate to have any Florida youth bowler miss out on this tournament opportunity as next year we will top \$100,000 in scholarship payouts again. The Pepsi Tournament is a USBC National event, sponsored by Pepsi, BPAA and Storm.

NOTICE: As always (only in Florida) former 1st Place Champions in any division are exempt from having to qualify for that tournament until they are no longer youth bowlers (even if they won while representing a different bowling center). A former champion will count toward the 1 in 4 ratio number but will be an automatic qualifier. The bowlers must be present and bowl on a qualifying day. *All entry fees for the appropriate division must still be paid.* If you are not sure and want to check if your bowler is a former champion, please send an email to Allen.

DIRECTORS NOTICE: There is an issue in BLS where it is putting kids into wrong Pepsi divisions. They released an update to fix it along with another Pepsi issue. The version needed is 36.02.06. Please get the update or you will have an issue!

I had the pleasure of serving on the Annual Meeting Committee this year and there is a lot of "behind the scenes" work that goes into putting on the Annual Meeting. The Florida State USBC held the Annual Youth Luncheon, Induction of Youth Hall of Fame, Memorial Service, Meeting, Election of Officers and Directors, Awards Dinner, Induction of Adult

Hall of Fame recipients and Tournament Bid Selection on October 14-15, 2023, at the Crowne Plaza at Bell Tower in Ft. Myers, Florida. It was a busy weekend. Unfortunately, the number of delegates has continued to decline over the years as has the number of certified bowlers in the State of Florida. There are many factors that contribute to the decline - health of the bowlers, the number of senior bowlers that are choosing not to certify (if they do not bowl tournaments) and the distance to the various meeting locations. The minority are making decisions for the majority. USBC has seen an increase in the number of certified bowlers overall which is a positive factor. Hopefully, in the future Florida will see an increase in the number of delegates that attend their State Meeting.

The attendance at the Youth Luncheon was the biggest I have seen in several years. The Youth State and Pepsi winners were presented with their plaques as their SMART funds have already been deposited in their account. The Youth Hall of Fame inductees credentials were outstanding to say the least. It will be interesting to see what their accomplishments are as they move into the collegiate and adult leagues and tournaments.

I also had the pleasure of serving as the Chair of the Nominating Committee this year. The delegation elected the following to represent the bowlers of the State of Florida for the next 3 years: Larry Butler, 1st Vice President, Portia Adkins, Bruce Combs, Margo Buzzard, Bobby Taylor, Daniel Higham and Kevin Summers as Directors. Tony Adkins and Debbie Whitten were elected as the USBC National Delegates to attend the USBC Convention in Las Vegas, Nevada, April 22 to 25, 2024. Alternate National Delegates elected are Fred McFarland and Toni Maddux.

Newsletter article awards were presented to the writers who contribute to the State Newsletter (March, June and November) and I received a second place for Outstanding Association Article and a first place for Best Overall Writer. What a nice surprise.

Anyone can submit articles to the State for the newsletter. Bowlers want to know what is going on all around the State so pick up a pen (or sit down at your computer) and share the news in your area - you could win an award next year.

There was no legislation this year so we must, as a Board, be doing something right.

Highlights of high games and series for the State in 2023 has Vito Sisto, of Marion County, with the High Scratch Series of 890 for which he will receive a merit award from the State of Florida. He also holds the Marion County USBC City Record for men for this

accomplishment.

Rita Rice, of Marion County, won the breast cancer bowling ball and was presented with it at the awards dinner. Way to go Marion County.

As a recap in 2024 the Annual Meeting and all the festivities will take place at the St. Petersburg Marriott Clearwater October 11-13, 2024. In 2024 the State Tournaments will be held on the following dates and at the following locations:

Pepsi - March 16 to April 21 (weekends only - no bowling March 30-31) in Tavares Mixed Memorial - April 6-7 and 13-14 in Ft. Lauderdale Open Tournament - May 4 through June 23 in the Polk County area Women's Tournament - May 18 through June 2 in St. Petersburg Men's Championship - October 26-27, November 2 through 17 in Ft. Myers Youth Scholarship - June 1 through 16 in Tampa/East Pasco Senior Women - October 19-20 and 26-27 in Ft. Myers

Guest speakers at the 2023 Annual Meeting were Darlene Baker, former President of USBC and now the BVL Ambassador for USBC. She spoke on this year's theme "Johnny P Bowl For Veterans" celebrating 50 Years of service by Johnny Petraglia pro bowler and Viet Nam Vet. Darlene showed a video highlighting BVL and all the programs that BVL supports.

November is designated BVL month. League secretaries should pass the hat or a bucket or a barrel to collect donations and send them to either your local veterans' hospitals and rehab centers or send your donation directly to the FSUSBC Association Manager who will forward them to BVL. Contact Darlene Baker for more information. Speaking of passing the hat the delegates at the annual meeting donated a little over \$600 for BVL!! Way to go bowlers.

Winners of the various State Tournaments were presented with their plaques at the Awards Dinner and the Hall of Fame Inductees accomplishments were shared with the attendees at the Awards Dinner and presented with their plaques. There were some tears and a lot of applause for their contributions to the sport of bowling.

David Fields, Florida's USBC Field Representative gave his presentation covering the 2023 USBC National Convention, legislation, increase in membership, Why I Certify, lane certification and string pin certification. As always David had the audience laughing.

As a member of the Tournament Committee, we review the bids submitted by the various

associations with backing by the centers in their area to present to the delegation for voting. This year the Annual Meeting wrapped up with voting for the tournament locations in 2025 and the winning bids go to:

Pepsi - Tallahassee USBC
Mixed - Southwest Florida USBC
Open - Gulf Coast USBC/Suncoast USBC
Women - Broward County USBC
Youth - Discover Lake County
Senior Women - Discover Lake County
Men's Championship - Broward County USBC

In Marion County our local association held the Annual Membership Meeting in May and attendance was less than the year before. Unsure why the bowlers complain about this and that or have questions that should be directed to their local association members; however, when they are given the chance to ask questions or bring suggestions (or criticism) to the local association they don't show up or sit in the meeting and do nothing. If the bowlers are not willing to speak up, then they do not need to complain. The annual league secretaries' workshop was held on August 5, 2023, where the league secretaries were given their league packets and other information necessary to hold their respective organizational meetings to floor their leagues. Not much had changed except that USBC is now certifying "string pin" bowling. At this point in time this does not affect the bowlers of Marion County as we do not (and probably will not have) string pin centers. The association hired a new Association Manager, Glee Lagasse and she was introduced to the officers at the meeting.

Local tournaments will be starting in November with the Senior Open and after the first of the year the Youth City Tournament, the Open City Tournament and the Women's City Tournament will follow wrapping up in March 2024, in time for the local delegates to prepare to attend the USBC Convention in Las Vegas.

Greetings from the Sarasota-Manatee USBC. I trust your association had a great start to the 2023-2024 bowling season. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the community of Lewiston Maine where a mass shooting began at Just-In-Time Recreation Center. May no other center have such a tragedy occur in their community!

Speaking of communities, the SMCBA participates in three community projects on a yearly basis. The one most bowlers are familiar with is the Boot Collection for BVL. It always occurs around Veteran's Day in the month of November. Board members and

Bowling Hall of Fame members collect donations from all leagues in our centers. Later the symbolic check is hand delivered to Bay Pines Veteran's Hospital.

Many years ago Janelle Hardin brought the concept of a 102 Club to our area. It has evolved into the 102/202 Club. Here's how it works: If you bowl a score of 102 or 202 in any frame of your game a monetary donation is appreciated. Some leagues set out envelopes on each pair of lanes for this, some simply hand the donations to a person in their league. The bottom line is that at the end of the season all money collected is turned over to the association manager. The board picks a charity that serves children and or disabled adults to donate the funds too. The money really adds up, usually a single dollar at a time! This past season we gave \$1,000.00 to Suncoast Charities For Children.

In recent years we have participated in a project supported in part by Crown Royal. Packages From Home is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization. Their mission is to send care and comfort packages to deployed American Troops. To date we have sent over 2,300 bags to this program at no cost to the association. A representative from your board simply signs up to participate, follow the directions given and wait for the prepaid shipping label to arrive by email. Sometimes it arrives quickly, sometimes it may take a couple of weeks to come in. Next step is to print label and take the package to UPS for shipping.

As you can guess these projects takes a little time and effort to accomplish, but knowing how much you have helped others truly is the only reward you need.

Thanks for reading this article. I hope it has inspired you to try a new project in your area. I would enjoy reading how your association helps their community. Perhaps it will inspire someone else too.

Now, they will put their balls on the rack, their shoes on their feet and locate the quickest and safest exit, just in case.
